Some property advertisements use specific abbreviations or terms to describe the accommodation. Here are the main ones:

TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

M²: Living space in France is measured in square metres. The minimum regulatory living space, whatever the accommodation, is: 9 $\rm m^2$ for one person, 16 $\rm m^2$ for two people, then 9 $\rm m^2$ for each additional person.

→ F1 / T1: flat with 1 room, 1 kitchen, 1 bathroom → F2 / T2: flat with 2 rooms, 1 kitchen, 1 bathroom → F3 / T3: flat with 3 rooms, 1 kitchen, 1 bathroom

AL: for rent Appt.: flat Asc.: fift

c.c: charges included

Ch.ind. el: individual electric heating

Et (ou etg): floor

FAI: agency fees included

Grd: large

HC: excluding charges H./.hono: agency fees

Kitch: kitchenette (sink, hob and fridge in the main room)

Meub.: furnished

Pft ét: perfect condition

Rdc: ground floor

Sdb (ou sb): bathroom

sdd: shower room, without bath

TCC: all charges included

Vis: visit
